• **Categories: #1** A book about an historical figure, **#44** A book written by an author whose first or last name begins with T, P, or L, **#47** A book written by multiple authors, and **#48** A book written by someone who is no longer living

#### Heavy by Kiese Laymon

• **Categories: #14** A book set in a school, **#22** A book that focuses on mental health, **#44** A book written by an author whose first or last name begins with T, P, or L, and **#45** A book written by an author whose last name is six letters or more

## Punching the Air by Ibi Aanu Zoboi

- **Categories: #3** A book about starting over, **#14** A book set in a school, and **#47** A book written by multiple authors
- Pushout by Monique W Morris
  - **Categories: #5** A book cover that shows a person from behind, **#14** A book set in a school, **#19** A book that begins with a disappearance, and **#45** A book written by an author whose last name is six letters or more
- Another Country by James Baldwin
  - **Categories: #12** A book published more than ten years ago, **#16** A book set on the East Coast of the United States, **#41** A book with best friends, **#45** A book written by an author whose last name is six letters or more, and **#48** A book written by someone who is no longer living

#### • Homegoing by Yaa Gyasi

• **Categories: #2** A book about or including a wedding and **#16** A book set on the East Coast of the United States

#### • Invisible Man by Ralph Ellison

- **Categories: #12** A book published more than ten years ago, **#16** A book set on the East Coast of the United States, **#45** A book written by an author whose last name is six letters or more, **#48** A book written by someone who is no longer living, and **#53** A philosophical literature or philosophy book
- The Warmth of Other Suns by Isabel Wilkerson
  - **Categories: #3** A book about starting over, **#12** A book published more than ten years ago, **#16** A book set on the East Coast of the United States, and **#45** A book written by an author whose last name is six letters or more
- The Fifth Season by N. K. Jemison

- **Categories: #19** A book that begins with a disappearance and **#45** A book written by an author whose last name is six letters or more
- Devil in the Grove by Gilbert King
  - **Categories: #1** A book about an historical figure and **#16** A book set on the East Coast of the United States

# **Category Questions & Answers**

## Not quite sure what a category is asking for?

Check out a few of the category questions our team has been answering since the challenge launched!



- QUESTION 1: What if I find a book that fits a category with a cover requirement but when I pick it up, the cover is different? Would it still count?
  - Answer: Yes, the book would still count as long as the intent was to acquire the correct copy or there is a version of the title's cover that does fulfill the category prompt. This goes for digital, large print, and audio versions as well.
- QUESTION 2: Would America be considered a country for the "A book that takes place in a country that starts with the letter A" category?
  - Answer: America would not count as it is the shortened version of United States of America.
- QUESTION 3: If I find a book rated 5 stars for the 'A book with a five star rating in the TPL catalog' category and read it or plan to read it, will it still count if the rating changes due to additional reviews?
  - Answer: Yes, if you searched and found a book that was 5 stars and read it (or plan to read it for that category) and the

rating changes, it would still count towards the category.

- QUESTION 4: Does the historical figure need to be someone that really existed, or could something like a retelling of Arthurian legend count for the 'A book about an historical figure' count?
  - Answer: Yes, the historical figure would need to be an individual that existed in real life.
